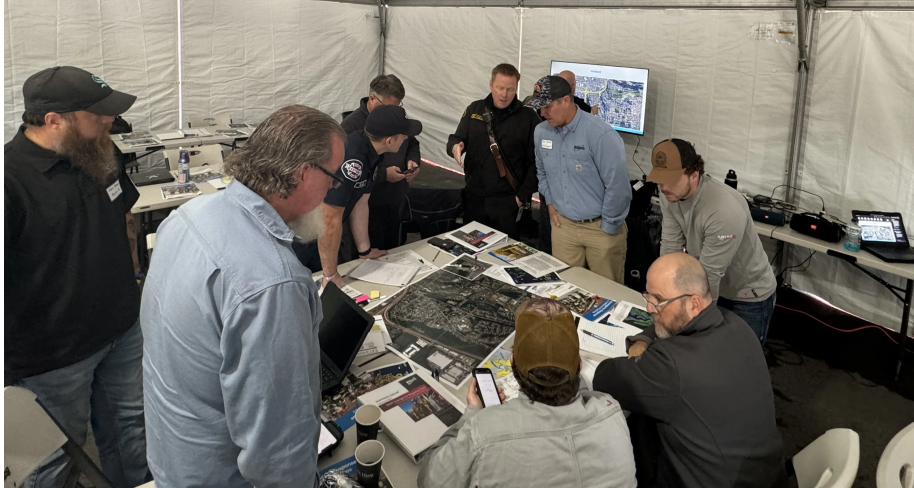
New employee spotlight
