**Certificates****Kemmerer Horsepower Replacement Project (Docket No. CP25-204-000)**

On October 9, 2025, FERC issued its Environmental Assessment ("EA") for the Kemmerer Horsepower Replacement Project. The EA evaluates the potential environmental impacts of the proposed facilities and will inform FERC's decision on the certificate application. The FERC staff concluded that approval of the proposed project would not constitute a major federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment. Comments on the EA were due on November 10, 2025.

**Ryckman Creek Loop Project (Docket No. CP26-18-000)**

On November 3, 2025, Northwest filed a request for authorization pursuant to the prior notice procedures of its Blanket Certificate to construct, install, modify, operate, and maintain the proposed Ryckman Creek Loop Project in Uinta County, Wyoming. The project will enable Northwest to provide an incremental 30,278 dth/day of firm transportation capacity. On November 13, 2025, the Commission noticed the request for authorization and established the deadline for protests, motions to intervene and comments to be January 12, 2026.

**Kelso-Beaver Reliability Project (Docket No. CP25-89-000)**

On February 27, 2025, Northwest filed an application pursuant to section 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act and Part 157 of the Commission's regulations to acquire the existing Kelso-Beaver Pipeline ("KB Pipeline"). Northwest also requested authorization to expand the KB Pipeline and make the pipeline bi-directional (Kelso-Beaver Reliability Project ("Project")). On November 20, 2025, the Commission issued its Order Issuing Certificate and Approving Abandonment ("Order"). On December 9, 2025, Northwest accepted the Order.

**Wild Trail Project (Docket No. CP25-497-000)**

On December 15, 2025, FERC issued its Environmental Assessment ("EA") for the Wild Trail Project. The EA evaluates the potential environmental impacts of the proposed facilities and will inform FERC's decision on the certificate application. The EA concludes that approval of the proposed project would not constitute a major federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment. Comments on the EA are due on January 14, 2026.
